## FAQs

### *What is Youth Leadership Brentwood?*

Youth Leadership Brentwood is a program of the Williamson County Chamber Foundation, the nonprofit affiliate of Williamson, Inc. Chamber of Commerce. The program is an intensive learning and networking opportunity. Class members meet with local decision-makers in many sectors, such as business and government, as well as learn about many of the community service agencies in our city. Youth Leadership Brentwood provides access to information that affects the lives of all who live, learn and work in Brentwood.

### *What is my time commitment during the program year?*

During the class year, expect to participate in the opening class reception, opening and closing retreats, all program days and the graduation ceremony.

### *What is my time commitment after graduation?*

Two class members will be elected to serve on the steering board for a one-year term as mentors for the following year's class.

## Need information or Have Questions?

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### *Who is eligible to apply?*

Our program is for sophomores and juniors who live within or go to school within the Brentwood city limits.

### *What are program days like?*

Each day begins at about 8:00 a.m. and ends at about 3:30 p.m. The exact timing for each day may vary slightly. Most days begin at the Williamson, Inc. Chamber of Commerce office. If needed, you will board a bus that takes you to each site throughout the day.

### *What can I expect at the opening retreat?*

In 2017, the opening retreat will begin with a welcoming reception for class members and their parents. After the reception, the parents leave but the class members continue with a retreat and participate in team-building exercises led by an experienced facilitator. The next day the class learns about the history of Brentwood and participates in a variety of leadership exercises. The retreat will be held on Wednesday, October 25 from 5-9pm, and on October 26 from 8am-3:30pm. You can expect to get to know your classmates through a variety of fun, teambuilding exercises as you learn more about the upcoming program year.

### *What is the application deadline?*

### *How many YLB graduates are there?*

There are 360 alumni. The first class graduated in 1996.

### *What happens if I miss a program day?*

Your commitment to the program is critical to its success. Missing a program day, unless due to an emergency or death in the family, will result in your dismissal from the program.

### *How is the class selected?*

The selection of class members is based on a variety of factors, including their connection to Brentwood and their demonstrated commitment to their schools and community. Ideally, each class will be comprised of leaders from a cross-section of various schools, representing the many special students who live in Brentwood.

### *What if I'm not selected?*

If you are a sophomore, we encourage you to reapply next year.

### *What are the costs involved?*

Tuition is \$300 per person and covers meals, transportation and program materials.
